- CMS recognizes the importance of disease prevention, early detection and lifestyle modifications that support the health of Medicare beneficiaries
- Medicare pays for many preventive benefits, including educating Medicare beneficiaries about potentially life-saving services and screenings

Deductible and Coinsurance Waived for Certain Preventive Services

- For DOS on/after 1/1/2011
 - Medicare deductible and coinsurance waived for preventive services included in this presentation
 - CR 7012, "Waiver of Coinsurance and Deductible for Preventive Services, Section 4104 of Patient Protection and Affordable Health Care Act, Removal of Barriers to Preventive Services in Medicare"





Did You Know

A beneficiary must be enrolled in Medicare
 Part B in order to be covered for any Medicare
 preventive services





Centers for Disease Control and Prevention

- One of major operating components of DHHS
- Nation's premier health promotion, prevention and preparedness agency
 - Supports state, local, federal health departments
 - Implements measures to decrease leading causes of death
 - Reforms health policies





Hepatitis B Virus Vaccine





Background

- Section 1861(s)(10)(B) of the SSA authorizes
 Medicare coverage of hepatitis B vaccine and administration for intermediate- and high-risk patients
 - Effective 9/1/1984





What is HBV?

- Found in blood and body fluids of infected people and can be spread
 - Through sexual contact
 - Through sharing of needles, other drug paraphernalia and razors
 - Through tattoos or body piercing
 - From a mother to her infant during birth
 - By living in household with chronically infected person





What is Hepatitis B?

- Serious disease caused by HBV
 - Attacks liver
 - Can cause chronic (life-long) infection, resulting in cirrhosis (scarring) of liver, liver cancer, liver failure, and death
- Can be prevented with HBV vaccine





Did You Know

- Hepatitis B vaccine is made by taking the part of the virus that makes surface protein and putting it into yeast cells
- Yeast cells produce many copies of the protein which are subsequently used to make the vaccine





Benefits of HBV Vaccine

- When administered, a patient's immune system provides protection against infection with the HBV
 - Best way to prevent HBV
- Prevent hospitalization and death
- Prevent further infection/spread of disease





Medicare Coverage Details

- Medicare beneficiaries at intermediate or high risk
 - Documentation must show patient is at intermediate or high risk
- HBV vaccine must be administered under a physician's order with supervision
- Medicare beneficiaries who are currently positive for antibodies for hepatitis B are not eligible for this benefit





Groups at High Risk for Hepatitis B

- ESRD patients
- Hemophiliacs who receive Factor VIII or IX concentrates
- Clients of institutions for the developmentally disabled
- Individuals who live in the same household as an HBV carrier





Groups at High Risk for Hepatitis B

- Homosexual men
- Illicit injectable drug users
- Persons diagnosed with diabetes





Groups at Intermediate Risk for Hepatitis B

- Staff in institutions for developmentally disabled
- Health care workers who have frequent contact with blood during routine work
- Heterosexually active persons with multiple sexual partners





Frequency of HBV Vaccination

- Follow the dosage schedule for the HBV vaccine
 - Usually given as three-four shots over a six-month period
 - After receiving all three doses, HBV vaccine provides greater than 90% protection





Claim Billing Requirements

- Submit claim on appropriate TOB
 - See next slide
- Report ICD-10 diagnosis code Z23





TOBs

ТОВ	Description
12X*	Hospital inpatient (Part B)
13X	Hospital outpatient
22X*	SNF inpatient Part B
23X	SNF outpatient
72X	Independent/hospital-based RDF
75X	CORF
85X	CAH





*TOB for HBV Vaccines for Inpatients

- Hospitals should bill for inpatients on 12X TOB using discharge date of hospital stay or benefits exhaust date
- SNF should bill for inpatients on 22X TOB





Line-Item Billing Requirements

- HBV vaccine
 - Revenue code 0636
 - Appropriate CPT code from list on next slide
 - One (1) unit
- HBV vaccine administration
 - Revenue code 0771
 - HCPCS code G0010
 - One (1) unit
- Note: CAHs report revenue code 096X, 097X or 098X





CPT Coding

CPT Code	Description	
90739	HBV, adult dosage (2-dose schedule)	
90740	HBV, dialysis or immunosuppressed patient dosage (3-dose schedule)	
90743	HBV, adolescent (2-dose schedule)	
90744	HBV, pediatric/adolescent dosage (3-dose schedule)	
90746	HBV, adult dosage (3-dose schedule)	
90747	HBV, dialysis or immunosuppressed patient dosage (4-dose schedule)	
90759	HBV, 3-antigen (S, Pre-S1, Pre-S2), 10 mcg dosage (3-dose schedule)	





Payment for Vaccine

Facility Type	Vaccine
Hospital (IP Part B & outpatient)	Reasonable cost
SNF (IP Part B & outpatient)	Reasonable cost
Hospital-based RDF	Reasonable cost
Independent RDF	95% AWP
CORF	95% AWP
CAH Method I	101% reasonable cost for TC
CAH Method II	Plus 115% MPFS nonfacility for PC





Payment for Administration of Vaccine

Facility Type	Vaccine
Hospital (IP Part B & outpatient)	OPPS or reasonable cost
SNF (IP Part B & outpatient)	MPFS
Hospital-based RDF	Reasonable cost
Independent RDF	MPFS
CORF	MPFS
CAH Method I	101% reasonable cost for TC
CAH Method II	Plus 115% MPFS nonfacility for PC





Beneficiary Cost-Sharing

- Based on ACA Section 4104
 - Deductible waived
 - Coinsurance/copayment waived





Why Claims Are Denied

- Beneficiary is not intermediate/high risk
- Not ordered by physician





What You Should Do Now

- Share this presentation with other internal staff members
- Talk to your patients about the importance of taking advantage of Medicare preventive services
- Update system with correct coding information
- Update any internal procedure to include verifying the patient's age and eligibility to receive preventive services to avoid costly, timeconsuming claim errors
