Medicare Hot Topics



What is the Medicare Program?

- Federally-administered health insurance program which covers people over 65 years of age and certain younger people with disabilities or ESRD
- Medicare benefits offer coverage for
 - ✓ Part A Hospital Insurance
 - Inpatient ex, hospital, SNF, CAH, FQHC, RHC, and HH+H
 - Part B Supplementary Medical Insurance (SMI)
 - Examples: Outpatient (Part B of A), Physician (Part B)
 - ✓ Part C MAO/HMO
 - Example: Medicare Advantage
 - ✓ Part D Prescription drugs



National Government Services

- Traditional fee-for-service contractor serving over 20 million people with Medicare in 20 states and 5 U.S. territories
- NGS serves 240 members of Congress
- NGS administers Medicare for Jurisdictions 6 and K (J6 and JK)
 - Medicare Part A (hospital insurance), SNF, RHC, and Medicare Part B (medical insurance)
 - Medicare home health and hospice for large number of states
 - Medicare free-standing FQHC contract in all territories and nearly all states
 - Develops and maintains web-based self-service tools

✓ Allows Medicare providers to have millions of interactions to answer their educational and billing needs

Acute Hospital Care at Home

- Acute Hospital Care at Home began as part of a comprehensive effort to increase hospital capacity, maximize resources, and combat COVID-19 to keep people safe
- The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 extended the initiative through 12/31/2024
- Hospitals can still apply to participate at <u>Qualitynet.cms.gov/acute-</u> hospital-care-at-home





Telehealth – FQHC/RHC and REH

- Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)/Rural Health Clinic (RHC) can serve as a distant site provider for non-behavioral/mental telehealth services
- FQHC and RHC furnish behavioral/mental telehealth visits through telecommunications technology
- Rural Emergency Hospitals (REH) are eligible originating sites for telehealth under certain circumstances

 - Be appropriate in submission

 - Be thorough in response

Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Billing Prohibitions

Dually Eligible Beneficiaries

- Dually eligible beneficiaries generally describe low-income beneficiaries enrolled in both Medicare and Medicaid
- Includes beneficiaries enrolled in Medicare Part A, Part B, or both and getting full Medicaid benefits or only help with Medicare premiums or cost-sharing through one of the Medicare Savings Programs eligibility groups





Medicare Savings Programs

- Qualified Medicare Beneficiary (QMB)
 - Pays Part A and Part B premiums, deductibles, coinsurance and copayments
- Specific Low-Income Medicare Beneficiary (SLMB)
 - Pays only the Part B premium
- Qualifying Individual (QI)
 - Pays only Part B premium
 - ✓ Individuals in this program have no other Medicaid eligibility
- Qualified Disabled Working Individual (QDWI)
 - Pays only Part A premium for certain individuals under age 65 with disabilities who have returned to work





QMB and Cost-Sharing

- Medicare providers cannot bill QMB beneficiaries for Medicare costsharing
- This includes Medicare deductibles, coinsurance, and copayments
- In some cases, a beneficiary may owe a small Medicaid copayment
- Medicare and Medicaid payments (if any) are considered payment in full
- Providers are subject to sanctions if they bill a QMB above the total Medicare and Medicaid payments, even when Medicaid pays nothing

Vaccines Updates & Campaign

Vaccine Coverage Under Medicare Part B

- Hepatitis B
 - Beneficiaries at high or intermediate risk of contracting Hepatitis B
 - <u>Hepatitis B Shot and Administration</u>
 - ✓ Order is required
- COVID-19
 - <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Shot Payment</u>
 - Medicare Billing for COVID-19 Vaccine Shot Administration





Vaccine Coverage Under Medicare Part B

Influenza

- Typically administered once a flu season
- Flu Shot and Administration
 - ✓ Order is not required
- Pneumococcal Pneumonia
 - Adults 65 years and older should receive 1 dose, 2nd dose 1 year after
 - Adults 19-64 with certain underlying medical conditions should receive 1 dose, 2nd dose 1 year after
 - <u>Pneumococcal Shot and Administration</u>
 - ✓ Order is not required







Vaccines Covered under Medicare Part D

- Shingles
- RSV
- Tetanus/diphtheria (TD)
- Tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (whooping cough) (Tdap)
- Hepatitis A
- Hepatitis B (low risk)

 The Disability Information and Access Line (DIAL) helps people with disabilities get connected to information about local community resources that support independent living. Launched in 2021 to help people with disabilities access COVID-19 vaccinations, DIAL also provides information about essential services such as transportation, housing support, disability rights, and more.

How Medicare Provider can Push Vaccines

- Ensure Medicare patients remain current with flu, pneumonia, COVID-19, and other vaccinations especially those with chronic diseases.
- Make sure a high-dose flu vaccine is given to people 65 and older
- Remind Medicare patients that they are eligible for the pneumonia booster
- Encourage flu & pneumonia vaccine during in-person or telehealth visits for Welcome to Medicare and Annual Wellness Visit (AWV)
- Flu and Pneumonia vaccinations are encouraged to help keep Medicare patients out of the hospital/ER where COVID-19 exposure would be increased
- Utilize Nurses and Medical Assistants to foster a culture of immunization with your Medicare patients
